to introduce a former Speaker of the Nebraska Unicameral from McCook, Nebraska, Don Thompson. Don, would you rise and say hello? Nice to see you again. Next motion is still on page 16. It is to strike Section 37. Mr. Clerk, will you read the section, please?

CLERK: Mr. President, Section 37, Program 924. The Board of Regents of the University of Nebraska is hereby authorized to restore the Temple Building and construct a theatre facility at the University of Nebraska - Lincoln, with a total project cost not to exceed \$6,149,249, which amount includes \$100,000 planning funds previously appropriated. There is hereby appropriated \$610,000 from the State Building Fund for the fiscal year ending June 30, 1980, to design the restoration of the Temple Building, design the theatre facility, and initiate construction of the theatre facility. There is hereby appropriated \$2,300,000 from the State Building Fund for the fiscal year ending June 30, 1981, to initiate the restoration of the Temple Building and complete construction of the theatre facility. There is hereby appropriated \$2,500,000 from the State Building Fund for the fiscal year ending June 30, 1982, to substantially complete the restoration of the Temple Building. It is hereby appropriated \$639,249 from the State Building Fund for the fiscal year ending June 30, 1983, to make final payment to the contractors and to complete purchase of equipment for the facilities.

SPEAKER MARVEL: The motion is to delete Section 37. If you are in favor of deleting vote aye, opposed vote no. Senator Murphy.

SENATOR MURPHY: Mr. President, I have a problem. We are going to incorporate all into one...

SPEAKER MARVEL: You have a problem!

SENATOR MURPHY: I have got several, forty-eight to be exact, but this bill is going to incorporate items jointly that were on the Governor's budget and were not. When we get to Final Reading it takes 30 votes to adopt two of the issues and 25 to adopt the other four and my question is, are we going to go this routine on Final Reading of a divided question or are we going to adopt the bill and if so, how many votes are we going to require now in order to make this illegitimate child legitimate?
