SPEAKER MARVEL: The House is still under Call.

CLERK: 20 ayes, 23 nays, Mr. President.

SPEAKER MARVEL: The motion lost. The last motion is on page 17 of LB 594 and this would delete Section 40. The Clerk will read Section 40 which is proposed to be deleted.

CLERK: Mr. President, Section 40, Program 902. The State Historical Society is hereby authorized to acquire the Lincoln Elks Building Lodge No. 80 property at 131 Centennial Mall North for utilization as a Heritage Center. There is hereby appropriated \$950,000 from the State Building Fund for the fiscal year ending June 30, 1980, for such acquisition.

SPEAKER MARVEL: The motion is to strike that particular section from the bill. So if you are in favor of striking vote aye, if not vote no. Senator Fitzgerald, your light is on.

SENATOR FITZGERALD: I was going to make an amendment to take this white elephant and give it to the zoo but I won't.

SPEAKER MARVEL: All in favor of striking vote aye, opposed no. Does somebody want to move the Call is raised? We aren't paying any attention to it. Okay, the Call is raised. Have you all voted? Where is Senator Haberman? Senator Haberman, where is he?

SENATOR HABERMAN: Roll call vote. Never mind, it won't do any good.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Record the vote.

CLERK: 16 ayes, 26 nays, Mr. President.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Motion lost. Okay, now to verify what we have done, we will now vote on what is left of the Haberman amendment which, in effect, is the chiller. So all those in favor of that motion, in other words, the Haberman amendment as amended. Right? Vote aye, opposed vote no. Do you know what you are voting on? If we can have the attention of the group maybe we can clarify this. That portion of the amendment, of the Lewis amendment to the Haberman amendment which has to do with the chiller is still alive. So all you are doing now is moving the amendment as amended and all that is left is the chiller. All of the motions to strike the
