CLERK: Mr. President, Senator Keyes now moves to amend the bill. (Read Keyes amendment found on page 1817 of the Legislative Journal.)

SPEAKER MARVEL: Senator Keyes. Senator Keyes.

SENATOR KEYES: There I am on. So that there will be no confusion and this is nothing that is going to cost any more money to the state. It simply says that \$35,000 of the cash fund that is allotted to the Games and Parks Commission can be spent to pave the parking lot at the aquarium. It is under water, mud and rock now. So I move for the adoption of this amendment. It doesn't cost the bill a cent.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Senator Warner.

SENATOR WARNER: Mr. President, I would like to just explain the...Senator Keyes, I guess indicated that there was x amount of dollars available in the NORDA fund and the other funds, cash funds that the Game Commission has. As a matter of fact there are probably more projects included in the bill, designated in the bill now than there will be cash fund. You cannot predict exactly how many dollars will be coming in, at least from the park permits so if you add the project it may or may not be done because there may or may not be money for it and it would be up to the Game Commission to fill in a
