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you a better estimate. I would say like someone might have said, a heck of a lot probably.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Senator Fowler, then Senator Reutzel.

SENATOR FOWLER: I guess I would like to inquire of...it is my understanding, Senator Schmit, that there are four sections to your motion and you singled out one in your opening. What does the first section do?

SENATOR SCHMIT: The first section strikes Section 29 which is the Safety Center at Kearney.

SENATOR FOWLER: Okay, completely eliminates that.

SENATOR SCHMIT: That is right.

SENATOR FOWLER: Is the second one with regards to the Eppley?

SENATOR SCHMIT: I intend to withdraw the second section and the fourth section, Senator Fowler.

SENATOR FOWLER: All right, and then in the section with the theatre arts building do you indicate what the total project cost is? Is there funds appropriated for that implementation?

SENATOR SCHMIT: I have offered \$100,000 for planning at this stage, Senator Fowler. If more could be used that would be meaningful to add additional funds at this time, if they could use them at this time.

SENATOR FOWLER: Okay. Well I would rise to oppose Senator Schmit's motion as amended to strike the Kearney Safety Center to go back to planning funds for the theatre arts building. This Legislature last year on an override of a veto appropriated planning funds for the development of the theatre arts facility which is an addition and a renovation and the renovation I would disagree with, Senator Schmit, that one would not recognize the building, the designs that I have seen that have been developed. It is very much recognizable as a previous facility. He indicates that it would not be used for what it was originally intended. Well the Temple Building, the theatre arts building, was not originally designed as a theatre building. That has been a more recent use and it has gone through many conversions so I think that Senator Schmit's amendment sets us back on this project a full year. It does not appropriate any more than \$100,000
