Thank you, Mr. Clerk.

SENATOR NICHOL: Mr. Chairman, does this require a majority or just 25?

PRESIDENT: Just a majority. Record the vote.

CLERK: 15, 16 ayes, 20 nays to raise the Call, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: The Call is not raised. We are still under Call. So now we have, I think all were here except...there were only a couple that were not here on that. Senator Haberman was one and he is here and Senator Frank Lewis. Senator Duis is excused. I think we are all here except Senator Lewis. Senator Lewis is now here, too. Haberman is here. So we will proceed then.

SENATOR KEYES: Mr. Speaker, I believe we are still under Call.

PRESIDENT: We are under Call and everybody is here I think that is supposed to be here.

SENATOR KEYES: And all other personnel must leave the floor.

PRESIDENT: Yes, you have everybody paying attention to you

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
