So we will strike the lid bill. We will say to the elected officials, be responsible to the people that elected you, meet their needs, and if you have to go over 7%, there is no lid. You can do anything you please. As the bill is written right now, Senator Cal Carsten, the property taxes under which we were implementing and working at that time was the only thing that was under the lid. Today you are putting everything under the lid except federal grants, and then to make sure that it works, you have taken the top off and let them go out through the top through various avenues. I brought one in and Senator Koch had it repealed.
