SPEAKER MARVEL: The motion is carried. The Chair is overruled. There is a motion on the desk. Clerk, read the motion.

CLERK: Mr. President, Senator Newell moves to reconsider the motion to overrule the Chair.

SENATOR NEWELL: Mr. President, members of the body, I move to reconsider the vote that we have just taken for a number of reasons. One, I think that we should not have voted on...it should not have been allowed to be a vote on a reconsideration in the first place since, in fact, we have allowed Senator Kelly to get away with a majority vote what would take 30 votes to change the rules and for that reason...

SPEAKER MARVEL: Excuse me, Senator Cullan, for what purpose do you arise?

SENATOR CULLAN: Mr. President, is Senator Newell's motion to reconsider on the agenda?

SENATOR NEWELL: Was Senator Kelly's?

SENATOR CULLAN: Yes, Senator Kelly's was on the agenda and was left five days before it was reconsidered.

SENATOR NEWELL: Where was...I can't see it on the agenda.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Okay, the Chair will put the motion on the agenda within the next five days. Your motion has been duly considered and in respect to the people who are here for a 3:15 meeting I think, without destroying any continuity that it would be in order to put this on the agenda within the next few days.

SENATOR NEWELL: I have a point of order, Mr. President. The point of order is, will it be that 221 will lay over since this has a direct and very important effect, my motion to reconsider has a direct and very important effect on that legislation and since this deals with the motion that would allow that to be reconsidered, you know, I should hope that the timeliness would allow for my motion to reconsider be taken up prior to that bill.

SPEAKER MARVEL: If you are asking the question, can you take up the advancement of the bill in view of your motion to reconsider, is that your question?
