I think to engage, to establish a precedent that says that we, the state, are going to go in and finance a private individual in building a building, building a parking ramp, whatever, when we take money of the state, and I am not talking about bonds, I am talking about the word "loan", when we take the money of the state and give it to a private developer, what effect do we have on all the other private developers in this state. What a marvelous means of competition to have the state loan you the money, finance it at a preferential rate and use taxpayers money to pay it off with. I ask that this amendment be removed from this bill if it is to be considered at all. There is no way we can begin to loan this state's money to private individuals. I ask for the adoption of the amendment.
