states matching shares in a variety of programs and I think we need to call every agency's attention to the fact that as federal funds are being used, that they use the discretion in their use realizing that the state may well never pick them up, and this is to make that very clear and it is being put in the intent bill so that it applies to all agencies regardless of whether or not we had it specifically in some of the other bills relative to particular programs. So I would move its adoption.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Motion is the adoption of the Warner amendment as explained. All those in favor vote aye, opposed vote no. This is to LB 596. Have you all voted? Record.

SENATOR WARNER: Mr. President, the purpose of this amendment is to make it very clear in the program classification structure which I have mentioned before which is the manner in which the University reports the expenditure of appropriations and the receipts that we can more clearly identify their revolving funds that they have internally from other fund sources and in part it is put in to avoid the problem that we had this year where a portion of some revolving funds were picked up with general fund money as part of the \$2 million fuss but this is put in here to assure that another year we would not have a like problem. So essentially it is a technical amendment but it will be useful for us to be able to follow University expenditures and receipts next year.

SPEAKER MARVEL: The motion is the adoption of the Warner amendment as explained to LB 596. All those in favor vote aye, opposed no. Have you all voted? Have you all voted? Record.

CLERK: 27 ayes, 0 nays, Mr. President.
