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The research does show that marijuana can be used as a treatment to take care of glaucoma. I would suggest and I certainly have a lot more faith and a much higher degree of faith in using marijuana as a treatment for glaucoma than I would laetrile, but at the very least we would be consistent by putting both of these substances together by having the state regulate them and control them, and I think that that would alleviate many of the fears that I have, and I think it would begin to provide for a workable and a safe bill. So I do support the DeCamp amendments.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Senator Kelly.

SENATOR KELLY: Mr. Speaker, I respectfully call the question.

SPEAKER MARVEL: The question has been called for. Do I see five hands? The question is, shall debate cease? All those in favor vote aye, opposed no. The motion is to cease debate. Please vote if you are interested in ceasing debate? The question before the House is, shall debate cease? Have you all voted? Record. Record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 26 ayes, 6 nays to cease debate, Mr. President.

SPEAKER MARVEL: The motion is carried. Debate is ceased. The Chair recognizes Senator DeCamp for the purposes of closing on his amendment.

SENATOR DeCAMP: Mr. President and members of the Legislature, I'd kind of like you to listen because I'd like to address all the arguments raised. Now, I repeat, I didn't write the rules. I didn't make the system the way it is, but you can pass that laetrile bill and it don't mean jack diddly because you've got the feds outlawing the use, and you can sit here and say that we're going to do this and we're going to eliminate the federal income tax, but Bernice, my good motherly Bernice, that ain't going to cut it. You're going to have to go through FDA. Now if you can do it with laetrile, why I can haul in 14 other drugs, mescaline and you name it, and we can pass the bill and we can say, well we got mescaline, and peyote, and you name them. You can't do her. All I'm doing is setting you up a system on something you claim is a legitimate drug for use in a legitimate treatment of some disease, cancer, and say, okay we'll give you the opportunity through medical control, medical authorities, the FDA, a procedure set up by them to utilize it. The same with marijuana...okay, you talk about no public hearing. For about four years now we have had public hearings on how
