SPEAKER MARVEL: The motion before the House is the adoption of the DeCamp amendment to LB 382. All those in favor vote aye, opposed no. We're voting on the DeCamp amendment. Have you all voted? We're voting on the DeCamp amendment to LB 382. Have you all voted?

SENATOR DeCAMP: I'll start a little early. How many are excused today?

SPEAKER MARVEL: Four excused.

SPEAKER MARVEL: The question is, shall the House go under Call? All those in favor vote aye, opposed no. Record.

CLERK: 18 ayes, 1 nay to go under Call, Mr. President.

SPEAKER MARVEL: The House is under Call. All legislators please take your seats. Record your presence. Unauthorized personnel please leave the floor. Senator DeCamp, do you want a roll call vote? If legislators will please take their seats, we will have the Clerk honor call-in votes. We are authorized to accept call-in votes. Senator DeCamp, do you want a roll call vote? Legislators...let's see, Senator Schmit, Senator Kahle, Senator Hasebroock, Senator Haberman, Senator Reutzel. Senator Schmit, will you please record...or you have, okay. They're all here, Senator DeCamp. Do you want to proceed? Do you want to proceed with the roll call? Clerk, call the roll. All legislators please take your seats. Hold the call. Okay, go ahead.

CLERK: (Roll call vote commenced.)

SPEAKER MARVEL: We're voting on the DeCamp amendment to the bill.
