SPEAKER MARVEL: Okay, read it once more, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: Mr. President, the amendment reads: (Read Maresh amendment.)

SPEAKER MARVEL: Have you all voted? Senator Maresh.

SENATOR MARESH: I was hoping we would not have to have a Call of the House, but with 22 votes, now 23 votes, if we could only get 2 more votes we would not have to have a Call of the House would we? How many are excused?

SPEAKER MARVEL: Have you all voted?

SENATOR MARESH: Thank you.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Record.

CLERK: 25 ayes, 1 nay, Mr. President.

SPEAKER MARVEL: There are two amendments on the Clerk's desk. I think we should proceed with those.

CLERK: Mr. President, Senator DeCamp had amendments, but he has been excused.

SPEAKER MARVEL: All right.

CLERK: Senator Hoagland now moves to amend and his amendments are on Page 1778.

SPEAKER MARVEL: The Chair recognizes Senator Hoagland.

SENATOR HOAGLAND: Mr. Speaker and colleagues, my amendment provides that the University have only two years in which to enter into agreements with the Legislatures or with the governments of other states, and if those agreements are not completed within two years, the agreements that are required under Section 1 of the act, why then the authorization entered into such agreements expires. Essentially what that will do is it will give the University two years to get this program off the ground, and if it's unable to do so in two years, will have to come back and have the project reauthorized by us. I think because there are enough serious questions about the merits of this vet college to begin with we really ought to put this sunset provision in so that we aren't going to have an open-ended authorization to go ahead with the vet college. I'd move the adoption of this amendment.
