we will not be increasing the sales tax rates or the income tax rates, but even if we do we will only be increasing the income tax rates and not the sales tax rates, and to do this we only invite disaster and I argue strongly that Senator Dworak and others really are intending to invite disaster, because they have had the privilege of setting their seven percent limitation and what they're angry at is that we've gone over seven percent even though we're providing property tax relief in two different areas in the process, to counties and to the schools. It ought to stand at \$10,000,000. We need something. It's better to say we're trying to reduce property taxes than tell the taxpayers that we're going to guarantee a property tax increase. I thank you.

PRESIDENT: The Chair recognizes Senator Keyes.

SENATOR KEYES: Mr. Speaker and fellow senators, I'm going to support the 10,000,000 and violently oppose the \$35,000,000. We have not put any money into any funds yet, so that absolutely means that the lid bill, the one that's on the total budget, is going to force an increased cost in the cost of operating those subdivisions of government, it's going to force it onto property taxes, and it's not going to be stopped at seven percent. If fifty percent of the income comes from property and fifty percent from the state, it will be a fourteen percent increase at the minimum. We are demanding that the people of this state and the various subdivisions of government have an increase in their property taxes. \$10,000,000 right here is not going to force an increase in the sales tax, or an increase in the income tax, it is my honest belief, at least this year. If it follows through next year that we increase the budgets, possibly this 10,000,000 or some 10,000,000 along the line is going to force an increase in the property taxes. I can tell you this much that this Legislature today if it passes \$35,000,000 is electing the next United States Senator whenever Charlie Thone chooses to refuse to be Governor and becomes United States Senator in Washington. Exon made a trip to Washington. He made it strictly by vetoing state aid to education every time it come up and the people across the state backed him, they backed him, they backed him and they backed him, and they're going to....Charlie Thone today is going to veto the \$35,000,000. He will veto that as sure as the sun is going to come up in the east tomorrow morning. So gentlemen, if you want to anoint Charlie Thone to be the next United States Senator, vote for \$35,000,000.
