SENATOR CHAMBERS: What page?

SENATOR DeCAMP: What page? I will send a copy over to you, Ernie.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Mr. Clerk... okay, but you can tell me then, the elements of the amendment.

SENATOR DeCAMP: Okay, second offense bookmaking, felony; what is called the virgin amendment that Paul Douglas and some others brought up which involved...

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Okay, you don't have to explain the amendment. I understand what they will be but I want to know the parts of this one. What all will be included in the one you are returning for?

SENATOR DeCAMP: Second offense.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: The felony?

SENATOR DeCAMP: Yes.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: And Senator Fitzgerald's item?

SENATOR DeCAMP: Senator Fitzgerald's item.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: And then one that deals with possession of gambling records?

SENATOR DeCAMP: Possession of gambling records but it is redone from what it was in the original statutes because of the problems you raised before, do you remember? Very specific on...they have to...do you know what I am saying?

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Senator DeCamp, to save time would you agree to a division of the question so we can take each one of those items? And I know we have to vote twice but there are some provisions that are in those amendments that I can not vote for and I would have to debate them but rather than all of it be tied in with the debate, it would help if we could separate the question. For example, why don't we take Senator Fitzgerald's amendment first as separate from what you have there and let it be an amendment by itself?

SENATOR DeCAMP: Maybe you could just tell me which part you have reservations about.
