SENATOR CHAMBERS: The felony and I still see problems in the records but I will let the records go and if somebody wants to challenge that in court they might can have that just all stricken down too because I think it is not as tight as it needs to be but the felony provision is what I really want to debate and I can do that independently of the other two items.

SENATOR DeCAMP: Well, I would rather just have a shot at it, at the whole thing because I have agreed with I don't know how many different people that have an interest in various directions that this is the best thing that can be done.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Then rather than debate with Senator DeCamp on this issue, Mr. Chairman, a division of the question is allowed when the items are independent and either one or the several can stand on its own merits separate from the others so I am asking for a division of the question and this is the division I would ask, that Senator Fitzgerald's motion dealing, or provision dealing with the pickle cards be separated from the portions which would deal with the felony provision and the gambling records.

SPEAKER MARVEL: If I understand you correctly, we are talking about two different amendments. One of them is Fitzgerald's and the others are DeCamp's. Right?

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Yes.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Okay, Senator Fitzgerald, do you want to move...we need to move to bring the bill back for the purposes of adopting your specific amendment. Do you so move?

SENATOR FITZGERALD: I so move, Mr. Speaker.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Okay, now, Mr. Clerk, have we read that amendment?

CLERK: No, sir, I have not. Mr. President, Senator Fitzgerald's amendment would read as follows: (Read Fitzgerald amendment found on pages 1962-1963 of the Legislative Journal.)
