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Comp Court has is quite different but they held something like 62,000 work related actions a year. Much of their work is administrative. They have to have a vast knowledge of medical...must have vast medical knowledge to handle these cases. It is the only court in the state that is self-supporting. In fact they showed...they picked up \$6,000 extra last year on premiums alone. The expert from New York who is a rate setter said because of the administration of the court, Nebraska is the only state in the Union whose workmen comp rates have gone down. You have another thing that there is no place for advancement as far as workmen's comp is concerned. I think that their salary base should be equal to the two other courts. Thank you.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Senator Dworak, do you have any close?

SENATOR DWORAK: Well, Mr. President and colleagues, Senator Nichol says he doesn't know what is right or doesn't know what is wrong. As Chairman of the Judiciary Committee he has no idea where we are. He says stick with the committee amendments. Well the fact of the matter is that we have amended the committee amendments already. We have got the DeCamp and Reutzel amendments on. Now we are no longer with the committee amendments. Now I am beginning to get the same feeling that Senator Nichol has is that the Judiciary Committee doesn't know where we are on this particular thing and we are throwing a dart against the side of a building, a dart at the Board and pulling these figures out of the hat and I am not a lawyer and I am not that knowledgeable in the Judiciary but I doggone sure have a strong gut reaction that a district judge who tries murders and all kinds of serious crimes has more responsibility than a workmen's comp judge and I don't think it takes somebody schooled in the law to make that kind of a decision, and for us to have a judges pay bill that has the workmen's comp judges at the same level as the district judge to me just doesn't make good common sense. I can't support this bill unless we get a spread in there between the workmen's comp judges and the district judges. Now I think for the record this ought to be part of the debate. The workmen's comp judges are not satisfied with this at all. In fact right now they are pretty hostile as to bringing this figure down. This is my own amendment. It is my own figure. I would agree with Senator Nichol. It is arbitrary. I pulled it out of the air. I looked at the spread of the judges and brought the workmen's comp court down. I have no justification or basis to settle on this figure but apparently Senator Nichol doesn't either
