SPEAKER MARVEL: Senator Newell, first of all, technically you withdrew your amendment, but as far as I am concerned your amendment is still in force so you will have to withdraw it another time because there is others whose lights are on and in fairness to them we can't rule one way for one and one way for the other. So your amendment is still here and you will have to withdraw it.

SENATOR NEWELL: Okay, fair enough.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Now, I recognize Senator Koch now. Senator Koch, your light is on. Senator Newell's amendment is still before the House until he withdraws it.

SENATOR KOCH: Mr. Speaker, Senator Newell withdrew it when he finished his first remarks.

SPEAKER MARVEL: In other words your contention is there is nothing before the House?

SENATOR KOCH: That is the reason I had my button on was to question the order of what we are doing here. He withdrew his motion when he walked away from the microphone.

SPEAKER MARVEL: He had a motion up here. He had a motion up here.

SENATOR KOCH: In that case, Senator Marvel, in my usual friendly spirit, I will yield some of my time to Senator Newell. Obviously he has additional questions of the Chancellor of the Exchequer.

SPEAKER MARVEL: The Chair congratulates you on your friendly manner. I appreciate it. Senator Newell, do you wish to be recognized before you withdraw your amendment?

SENATOR NEWELL: Yes, I do. I would like to ask Senator Warner a question, because it is my intention Senator Warner I spoke to you specifically about University faculty and professional employees in the University but it is also my intention to make this professional provision all the way across the line. Is it necessary then to continue with the motion and request that it be brought back to change that or can the legislative intent bill give the appropriate notice to other department heads in state government?

SENATOR WARNER: No. First, I can answer your question is it would not be binding in the intent language, Senator Newell. On the other hand, there is nothing in LB 586 or
