SENATOR VENDITTE: At this point then, I think you are indirectly advising me then to withdraw my previous motion.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Senator Venditte, would you like to put a motion up on the Clerk's desk so we can act on it? There is nothing before the House.

SENATOR VENDITTE: Mr. Speaker, could I ask the Clerk a question, please? Would you allow me to do that? It will just take a matter of seconds.

SPEAKER MARVEL: You can pose a question to the Clerk. Is there a motion on the Clerk's desk?

CLERK: Mr. President, Senator Venditte moves to overrule the Speaker's agenda and stay on LB 382 until a vote is taken on advancement to E & R engrossment.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Is that your motion?

SENATOR VENDITTE: That is my motion, Mr. Speaker.
