I was not necessarily upset but I certainly was interested yesterday when we had 285 on Final and found such a glaring defect in our procedures or in the bill that may have been caused by our procedures that I have been doing quite a bit of visiting with SID people and attorneys as to attempting to determine what caused, what to me is a horrendous problem in financing of SID's in the small towns and villages. At this moment I have no answer to report other than what Senator Dworak reported regarding the misplaced vote, that may strictly be the case here. After the thousands and thousands and thousands of amendments that have gone across this floor, one finally stuck on the wall instead of the ceiling and we are correcting that now. I thank Senator DeCamp for his efforts and work in the area of straightening this out because it is extremely serious. I would state and ask Senator DeCamp to follow my statement, not necessarily as a question, just for correction if it is wrong Senator DeCamp, it is my understanding that with 479 we are restoring the Nebraska statutes to their conditions prior to LB 1 and LB 285 as amended, is that right?

SENATOR DE CAMP: In a very limited area of....

SENATOR KELLY: In SID's, small towns and villages.

SENATOR DE CAMP: Very limited projects, projects that fall within about forty different statutes for limited paving districts that are set up under those for which by the way in answer to Senator Keyes, there is no process available
