SENATOR DE CAMP: The answer is yes.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Senator Johnson, have you completed your discussion?

SENATOR JOHNSON: Yes, I have.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Senator Duis, do you wish to be recognized? Your light is on.

SENATOR DUIS: Mr. President, Senator DeCamp, where are you?

SPEAKER MARVEL: He is coming. Senator Duis has a question.

SENATOR DUIS: I have to be positive if what you are doing is what I think you are doing.

SENATOR DE CAMP: The new language.....

SENATOR DUIS: Now let me ask the question and merely say yes or no. Senator DeCamp I have a situation where there is a road improvement through a town, underway, contract has been let. Are you paying attention to me?

SENATOR DE CAMP: Yes, I'm listening to you and I'm hoping that other people are too. Go ahead.
