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buses more frequently. Precisely what was the \$300,000 earmarked to do, Senator Warner?

SENATOR WARNER: You will recall perhaps, Senator Johnson, some years ago the Legislature enacted legislation for ten cent fare and we have rather consistently had very gradual increase in the general fund replacement. Some years it has been a static amount of reimbursement. Those funds are reimbursed to Lincoln, Omaha and to rural areas where they have such facilities and this is an expansion of an aid program over the current \$1,600,000 that is returned. I think the consensus of the committee again, when we are talking about reducing it is not because something is bad. It is just that we can't do everything. Same position that every other citizen is with their household account. We cannot do everything. We have to pick and choose. This is an expansion. It seems to me in tight times why expansion programs are ones that you need to look at. This will represent some increase for mass transit but not as much as was in the original bill.

SENATOR JOHNSON: Now, Senator Warner, was the expansion done so that more elderly persons could take the bus or more disabled people could take the bus? Is that why the \$300,000 was in there to begin with?

SENATOR WARNER: Well, I guess the way to put it is the \$300,000 was in there to more fully reimburse local government for the ten cent fares, as a matter of fact, and this will be some expansion in that replacement but not as much as was in the original proposal.

SENATOR JOHNSON: Thank you, Senator Warner.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Senator Haberman.

SENATOR HABERMAN: Mr. Chairman, I have a question of Senator Warner.

SENATOR WARNER: Yes.

SENATOR HABERMAN: Senator Warner, would you please think about when you hand out a sheet like this that you just handed out to list on there, the title that you are changing? In other words, page 4, line 7, would be mass transit and then state colleges and community colleges. I think it would help us if it was printed on the sheet the title of what you are reducing or increasing. Please.
