and the full cost of the building requires a contribution on the part of the Fair Board out of their operating money as well as some state money. I guess it is consistent with some of the other projects that we have approved in recent years where there is some general fund money and some non-general fund money required for construction so it is consistent with that philosophy but the overall reduction in the bill would be \$341,000 of general fund money this year.

SENATOR HABERMAN: Senator Warner, as I understand it, the remodeling of the Eppley Building, the Theatre Arts Building and the Elks Museum Building are still in the budget bills. Is this correct?

SENATOR WARNER: Those are still in. This proposal makes no change from what the majority of the Legislature voted on these issues the other day.

SENATOR HABERMAN: Thank you, Senator Warner.

SENATOR WARNER: The only change we are making is within one campus.

SENATOR HABERMAN: Senator Cope, may I ask you a question, please?

SENATOR COPE: Yes.

SENATOR HABERMAN: Are you aware, Senator Cope, that they are taking out the Ag-Engineering Building and leaving the Eppley Building, the Theatre Arts Building and the Elks Museum in the bill?

SENATOR COPE: I am aware of that.

SENATOR HABERMAN: Thank you. A question of Senator Rumery.

SENATOR RUMERY: Yes.

SENATOR HABERMAN: Are you aware of the same three questions I asked Senator Cope?

SENATOR RUMERY: Yes, sir.

SENATOR HABERMAN: Thank you very much. Well the only thing I can say is this, being from western Nebraska, that is just jim-dandy. Cut the west, save the east, give them everything they want but those western Senators don't have the votes.
