SPEAKER MARVEL: Any other discussion? Okay, the motion... Do you want to read the motion again, Pat?

CLERK: Mr. President, the motion is to suspend Rule 7, Section 3a to take up the indefinitely postpone motion today.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Do you close, Senator DeCamp? All those in favor of suspending the rules vote aye, opposed no. Have you all voted? The motion is to suspend the rules to take up the bill today, take up the kill motion today. Record the vote. A record vote is requested.

CLERK: (Read record vote found on page 2180 of the Legislative Journal.) 34 ayes, 7 nays and 8 not voting, Mr. President.

SPEAKER MARVEL: The motion is carried. The rule is suspended. Before we get to the next motion, in the South balcony from Senator Wesely's district it is my privilege to introduce twenty-three senior students from Northeast High School, Lincoln, Nebraska. Mel Berka is the instructor. Will you hold up your hands so we can see where you are? Welcome. Senator Venditte, are you ready for your kill motion? The rules are suspended to take up the motion now instead of hold over the bill.

SENATOR VENDITTE: I have nothing further on the motion, Mr. President.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Okay, the motion is the indefinite postponement of LB 262. Senator Kahle, do you wish to be recognized?

SENATOR KAHLE: Mr. Speaker, members of the body, over the weekend last week a great effort was made to, I guess, spare the Governor, make things work out easy over in the other corner of this building. I think those of you that support the Governor have a good chance right now to help him out one more time by killing the bill. Thank you.
