will be well spent and I grant there is probably not enough of them, but \$300,000 is better than none. It is better than none and that is the alternative Senator Schmit is offering us. So I would certainly, certainly urge everybody to seriously consider the total ramifications of this amendment, the late date, the lack of complete thorough information.

PRESIDENT: The Chair recognizes Senator Kahle.

SENATOR KAHLE: Mr. Speaker, members of the body, I oppose the amendment but for an entirely different reason. I don't know where Senator Dworak has been lately but if he would look at the stock market he would find that Archer Daniels Midland is one of the main producers of alcohol for power purposes as stock is going wild, the Staley Company also. So perhaps private industry will take up what he is so afraid of, facing up to in Nebraska. One of the reasons I oppose this is because, the amendment that is, is because it is only a face saving issue and for the record I want to make it perfectly clear that I am as a big a supporter for the gasohol program as any of you but putting \$300,000 into the program is not even worth the paper it is written on. It is not enough to get things going. It is not enough to cause anybody to turn over and do something about it. Perhaps we will have to wait for private industry and I know it is coming, but I guess what bothers me the most is that last year we passed a bill and the number of the bill slips my memory at the moment, but we promised or pledged two and a half million dollars for five communities to build alcohol plants. We had four bona fide applications. This year Senator Hefner put an amendment on a bill that would provide a million dollars or two-fifths of what we promised. Now we have chickened out on that. We are not going to do anything. This is just a face saving deal. Don't kid yourself. \$300,000 isn't going to go very far in trying to promote gasohol in Nebraska and it might go quite a ways building dams to hold water. I think we are just kidding ourselves this morning and vote any way you want to but I want to put it in the record that we are not supporting gasohol with this bill. Thank you.
