LB 571

PRESIDENT: All right, the motion before the House is the return of LB 571 for the Warner amendment. All those in favor vote aye, opposed nay. Record the vote.

CLERK: 32 ayes, 0 nays on the motion to return, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: The motion carries. LB 571 is returned. Senator Warner, you may move the amendment.

SENATOR WARNER: Mr. President, I move that the amendment be adopted.

PRESIDENT: Motion to adopt the amendment is moved by Senator Warner. Is there any discussion? Senator Keyes, do you wish to speak to the motion on the adoption of the amendment?

SENATOR KEYES: Yes. Two things. First of all I would question the Chair's right to call....to take votes from someone outside of the chamber when we're under Call. If that is the policy then I could be in Washington D. C., call in and ask for a Call of the House and it would be recognized. I just want you to realize that.

PRESIDENT: What is your point, Senator Keyes? I don't believe I get it.

SENATOR KEYES: You got....I think you took a....a man called for the question and he was outside of the chamber, and if a man outside the chamber is allowed to vote then...

PRESIDENT: He was not outside the chamber.

SENATOR KEYES: He was outside the chamber. I seen him open his door and stick his head inside.

PRESIDENT: Well....

SENATOR KEYES: We'll forget about that this time.

PRESIDENT: As far as I'm concerned he was here because this House is under Call and he was at his desk as far as I'm concerned.

SENATOR KEYES: Oh, and you can see them in the hall, Senator Luedtke, how do you do.
