Those are where the bills come from, you know it, I know it, and my mother knows it. Unfortunately the public doesn't, because they don't want to tell the public where they come from. They get in a little house and they set around and they say, boy, don't those guys introduce a lot of bills....don't those guys really get carried away, and I think that they are entitled to share some of the glory. I think if Johnny DeCamp's got a banking bill, it ought to say, introduced on behalf of the Nebraska Bankers' Association, or the Omaha National Bank, or introduced on behalf of Kearney State College, or introduced on behalf of the AP reporters, or introduced on behalf of the Lincoln Journal, and they have had one or two here, or introduced on behalf of Harold Anderson, and he's had one or two here and I think Senator Koch just handled one for downtown Omaha. Now if you really want to get at the cards, you will slow down the introduction of bills by fifty percent by having their name ride on it with you, and I think that one of the problems that's happened in this Legislature for a long time is there hasn't been due public respect given to special interest groups and to lobbyists, and it's my sincere desire...it's my sincere desire to allow them to have part of the blame and part of the credit along with the members of the Legislature. You don't have to talk about ten bill limits. You don't have to talk about how many committee bills, because if somebody's got to put their name along with little Howard Lamb, then I'll tell you who is going to get the criticism, because they have been in a position for the last two years. The Omaha Chamber of Commerce this year said we ought to meet every other year because we introduce too many bills, and they can't wait to send enough people out in that rotunda to fill it on 158's and 251's, etc., etc., etc. I think it's time that we illuminate the issue. I think it's time that we let people know exactly where these bills come from. Most of them are not new ideas by the members. I'll tell you it's worse than a cattle auction out there on the tenth day. Guys are running around with rag-tag bills and trying to stick them to this guy and that guy and asking the Clerk, how many bills has the guy got. They'll let anybody carry it, and the end result sometimes proves that, Mr. President, but I don't want to get into those kind of comments. So if you really want to do something about bill limitation, let's get with
