CLERK: 24 ayes, 1 nay to go under Call, Mr. President.

SPEAKER MARVEL: The House is under Call. All legislators please return to your seats. Record your presence. There are no excused absences. I think I'm correct. Is that right? All legislators please take your seats. Record your presence. Senator Koch, Senator George, Senator Keyes, Senator Beutler, Senator Lamb, Senator DeCamp, Senator Haberman, Senator Brennan, Wagner, Fitzgerald, Newell, Marvel, Marsh, Labedz. Mr. Sergeant at Arms, will you...Senator Haberman, we need your presence. It's all right, Ray. Okay, Senator Newell, everyone is accounted for.

SENATOR NEWELL: Could we have a roll call vote?

SPEAKER MARVEL: Call the roll.

CLERK: (Roll call vote was taken which may be found on Page 2318 of the Legislative Journal.)

SPEAKER MARVEL: All legislators are in their seats. We had a little discussion a while ago whether the rule applied to a few or everybody. Okay, proceed.

CLERK: 27 ayes.....are you voting, Senator? Senator Pirsch voting aye. 28 ayes, 19 nays, Mr. President.
