PRESIDENT: Does everyone have a copy? All right.

SENATOR FOWLER: Good. I would move proposed rule change page 1, miscellaneous rule changes. Again, let me just say the goal was to encourage the Speaker to get the daily agenda to us twenty four hours in advance. It is not mandatory because understandably it will not always be possible for this agenda to be finalized. The hope was to get more notice to the membership of the daily agenda. PRESIDENT: We can move rather rapidly and then have no argument but we will center our attention on each rule. If there is no debate, no argument we will vote on it. Any one wishing to speak? Why doesn't everyone turn their lights off now and those that want to speak on the first rule put their lights on. All right, Senator Carsten has had his light on. Senator Beutler and Senator Kelly.

SENATOR CARSTEN: Mr. President and members of the Legislature, on this first one I would like to ask Senator Fowler a question and then I would like to ask Senator Marvel a question. First of all, if I may, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: Yes, proceed.

SENATOR CARSTEN: Senator Fowler, is it your intent that for nine o'clock tomorrow morning agenda that it is anticipated that nine o'clock this morning the Speaker would have the agenda on our desk? Is that your anticipation?

SENATOR FOWLER: That would be the... Senator Beutler is shaking his head no. It would be the hope that that could be done. It may not be possible to do that in every case but at least by five o'clock today that when we left that we would be able to have tomorrow's agenda or four-thirty or whenever we adjourn.
