judgment is that that sort of procedure could create additional problems and that committee chairmen may not want to be recessing meetings to try and bring members in. It may not be possible to find them. There may be legitimate reasons that we are not at a committee hearing, such as, to present a bill before another committee. And so it is our hope that by stating a policy that quorums be maintained at public hearings, that committee chairmen do all that they can within their powers of moral suasion and other authority to keep that quorum. One of the reasons that this was brought forth is that there had been a number of concerns, again in the survey, that people come to the Legislature to testify and they find that there are only two senators sitting on the committee and they question whether their testimony, in fact, will be heard by the committee so these two sections deal with quorum. Section nine on page 11, there is really no substantive change. There have been some little changes on language to make it read smoother but there is no change with regard on temporary appointments.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Excuse me, Senator Goodrich, do you wish to be recognized?

SENATOR GOODRICH: Yes. In going back to seven and eight on page 10, have you got them in front of you?

SENATOR FOWLER: Yes.

SENATOR GOODRICH: Could you read carefully, on seven now, it is a majority of the members of the committee shall constitute a quorum. No committee shall transact any business other than a committee hearing. In other words, you and I were on a committee where we had a scheduled hearing where we did not have a quorum. We went ahead and heard the people that came. I have got no problem with that but then the very next one here you say a quorum of committee members shall be maintained throughout all committee hearings. I think you have got a conflict between the two, haven't you?

SENATOR FOWLER: I think when we say "should be maintained", the intent is that an effort be made to do that. Maybe we should change "should" to something milder. I didn't have the traditional grammar so "should" and "shall" is not always....but I think there is a difference in intent between "shall be maintained" and "should be maintained".

SENATOR GOODRICH: Okay, I have got it. Okay.
