SPEAKER MARVEL: Mr. President, I move that a committee of five be appointed to escort the Governor to the Chamber to deliver his State of the State and Budget message.

PRESIDENT: Motion to appoint a committee of five to wait on the Governor to make his State of the State address. All those in favor of the motion vote aye, opposed nay. Record the vote.

CLERK: 30 ayes, 0 nays, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: The motion carries. The Chair will appoint the following committee to advise the Governor: Senator Cullan, Senator Hefner, Senator Marsh, Senator Schmit and Senator Sieck. Senator Cullan, Senator Hefner, Senator Marsh, Senator Schmit and Senator Sieck. The Legislature will be at ease until the Committee returns waiting on the Governor.

PRESIDENT: Senator Carsten, will you...Senator Schmit evidently is not here, would you be a member of that committee to escort the Governor? The Chair recognizes Speaker Marvel while we are waiting for the committee to return. The Speaker has an announcement to make. Speaker Marvel.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Immediately upon the end of the speeches by the Governor I think it would be profitable if we took about a fifteen minute recess, had the committees, if they so desire to meet, to sign whatever bills they might be interested in so they can get them on the Clerk's desk before the noon deadline. So my motion is that immediately upon the Budget and the State of the State that the Legislature take a fifteen minute recess so the committees can meet and determine whether they have bills ready to present. This will help the committees to meet the deadline so that they can be referred this afternoon.

PRESIDENT: Mr. Speaker, you are merely putting this on your agenda as an agenda item so it doesn't need to be a motion if there is no objection.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Okay. All right.

PRESIDENT: It is just considered to be part of the agenda following the Governor's address. Ray Wilson, Sergeant at Arms.
