

going through Congress, something other than one man deciding overnight that this is the new policy, and don't kid yourself that is the net effect. So I submit to you the embargo language which Senator Hoagland is trying to remove is the very heart of this, and this issue whether embargoes on food, which means control of food, control of the whole segment of agriculture by a single man, if this is going to be the new principle, the new allowance, then let us lay it out on the table for what it is. I don't believe we are ready at this point in this country to turn agriculture over to this new system.

PRESIDENT: The Chair recognizes Senator Nichol.

SENATOR NICHOL: Mr. Chairman and members of the Legislature, I heartily endorse what Senator DeCamp has just said, and I might add a couple of sentences. If we believe in this resolution at all, I don't see how we can consider Senator Hoagland's amendment. I learned a long time ago in a class in school that when you butcher a cow or a beef you cut it down in the middle and what falls in the tub is called the viscera. Some other people have another name for it. But to me Senator Hoagland's amendment takes out the viscera of this amendment in the first place...of this resolution in the first place. Secondly, Yogi Berra said a long time ago, you made the wrong mistake. Well I think a wrong mistake has been made by making agriculture alone the scapegoat of this situation, this international situation. The T.V. in the last two or three days has been reminding us it hasn't been too many weeks ago that our President said something like, SALT is essential for the peace of the world. They then showed the President within the past few days saying, SALT should not be. It hasn't been long ago that the expression was, I am proud of you, Bert. Well, I wonder how proud we are today of Bert. We need not to speak as one voice. When we think something is wrong we should say, I think this is wrong, whether it be one of us, a citizen in the state of Nebraska or the President. If we think something is wrong, say so. And I think this resolution by Senator Schmit says something and it says, we think it is wrong and we should stand up and be positive and say, no.

PRESIDENT: The Chair recognizes Senator Chambers.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Mr. Chairman and members of the Legislature, there was only one aspect of this resolution I had intended to speak on, and my intention was not to deal with the resolution as such so much as what it revealed about the Legislature and the mindset of the people in this country in
