

must be wrung from the citizens, you seem to have a contradiction. Free means absence of interference, whether that interference be pro or con. So the free enterprise system is not meant really to be free. It is meant to have a system which can ask for subsidies from the government up to any amount necessary to ensure a certain margin of profit. So instead of a free enterprise system, it should be a profit system to be guaranteed by the federal government. Since there are certain requests in this resolution which would require the expenditure of tax money, I felt that if the seven percent lid is the thing that the state really believes in, then seven percent should be the limit on any amount requested from the government for any purpose. But I say again in the interest of time, I am not going to push for the amendment. I did want to present it and I was going to push for it in all seriousness. I thought this was one of those resolutions that would pass through without discussion, but since this amendment was for discussion purposes and that purpose has been met, I would ask unanimous consent to withdraw it.
