

every health care facility with the passage of this bill will then be expected to carry this particular prescription for medicinal purposes in treating cancer therapy. Okay, now for those of you, and I see some of you are following along with me and I appreciate that, but now we are on Section 7 of the bill, Section 7. It states that no physician will be held liable for administering laetrile in accordance with Section 5 of this act and, of course, I think the same is true for any other treatment that a physician gives today and we are just simply protecting the physician with regarding his treating a cancer patient with laetrile. Subsection (2) of Section 7 says this. It states that this act does not prohibit the Department of Health and the Director of the Bureau of Examining Boards from investigations and actions against any medical practitioner's license and I think that, in itself, is somewhat self-explanatory. In Section 8 of the bill, it states that no health care facility or physician is exempt from liability in the administration of laetrile, I think that has been covered somewhat in another section, that I think is somewhat redundant information, but Section 9, and I have only got three more sections to go, states that this act does not require the administration or stocking of laetrile by any physician or health care facility. Section 10, it states what pharmacies should include on labels of laetrile, and again I think this is in the best interest of the cancer patient. Section 11 states by what means and in what areas the state shall adopt rules and regulations pertaining to laetrile and then, of course, the final section, Section 12, has to do with the penalties relative to this bill. I might just add, ladies and gentlemen, that there have now been I believe twenty-one states, and that is a confirmed figure, there are now twenty-one states that have now legalized laetrile. Colorado has just recently within the last six to eight months passed similar kind of legislation that we are attempting to get passed here this afternoon. Mr. Speaker, I was going to relinquish any additional time that I had to Senator Labeledz or Senator Kahle if they had any opening comments. How much time do I have, Mr. Speaker?
