SENATOR NEWELL: Mr. President, members of the body, I would like to withdraw that amendment in deference to Senator Labeledz and my good friend, Senator Venditte, who have worked hard to try to get this to a vote. For that reason that my amendment would not be one that they could accept, I will vote no on the issue but the amendment is not necessary to be discussed at this time and so for that reason I ask unanimous consent to withdraw it.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Any objection to the unanimous consent request? If not, so ordered. Next item, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: Mr. President, Senator Stoney now moves to amend. His amendments were printed on page 1920 of the Legislative Journal last year. Copies are being disseminated on the floor right now, Mr. President.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Senator Stoney.

SENATOR STONEY: Mr. President, members of the Legislature, I believe there are two amendments and I would like to take the amendment to the amendment before taking the amendment in its totality, if I might.

CLERK: Mr. President, Senator Stoney did have an amendment to his pending amendment and that was found on page 2000 of the Journal last year. It, too, is being distributed on the floor.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Okay, you want to take up the first amendment that is found on page 2000, is that right?

SENATOR STONEY: Yes, Mr. President.

SPEAKER MARVEL: The Chair recognizes Senator Stoney.

SENATOR STONEY: Simplistically what this accomplishes is that with the amendment that we will consider subsequently it was self-defeating, and to clear up that inconsistency, I am merely striking the language "or has dispensed laetrile to a physician." Now that is found in Section 6 and I would move for the adoption of that amendment so that we might discuss the amendment that I have to this proposal.

SPEAKER MARVEL: The motion is the adoption of the first Stoney amendment. Is there any other discussion? All those in favor of that motion vote aye, opposed no. Have you all voted? Record.
