

with more certainty what is happening. The bill even goes beyond that. It provides training to county attorneys. I assure you in talking with several people who have gone to law school they never really get into any discussion about what to do when they are confronted with their first dead body. Yet these people as county attorneys are expected to somehow to have a certain knowledge or expertise. This would provide training to county attorneys, it would provide training to local law enforcement so that when they would come into a circumstance such as in McCook they could look at the situation and be able to determine that indeed this needs further investigation.

PRESIDENT: Time is about up, Senator.

SENATOR FOWLER: So, I would say that this goes beyond just getting better investigation or better medical-legal. It trains and improves law enforcement through out the state. I think that is very important. I think that it is valuable that the county attorneys have offered a substitute draft and at this point I think we should adopt that.

PRESIDENT: Chair recognizes Senator Carsten.

SENATOR CARSTEN: Mr. President, I would like to ask Senator DeCamp a question but I don't see him. Maybe Senator Chambers...

PRESIDENT: Senator Chambers, will you respond?

SENATOR CARSTEN: The original bill had an "A" bill, whether it was \$302,000 something like that, is there any fiscal response to the amendment that you are aware of? Do you have any idea what that is?

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Senator Carsten, I'm going to be totally candid about these amendments. There are some of them I say that I have difficulty with so I would rather somebody else discuss the fiscal impact because we don't have a clear determination even with these amendments of everything that would have to be funded. Senator Maresh raised the issue of district pathologists or medical examiners. I really can't honestly give you an answer to the question.

SENATOR CARSTEN: Do you have an idea who on the committee would have an idea. Bill, Senator Nichol, maybe....

PRESIDENT: Senator Nichol, can you answer that?

SENATOR NICHOL: Senator Carsten, I don't know what the fiscal impact is on the bill as it now stands. Now the figures that were bantered about at the original hearings at the finale were
