

be rules and regulations set up by this advisory board and I wonder if there is to be any correlation whatever between the two or if they are in a different area that I am not seeing the need for these two, what seem to be overlapping provisions.

SENATOR DeCAMP: I think that they are distinct provisions and I will try to give a couple of examples to illustrate. Policies and procedures. Let's assume the board gets together, they have their pathologists who are going to be involved, whether they are on a contract basis or whatever, and they say, look, if it is a death at night call by the sheriff, so on and so forth, the person closest may go, a hundred miles or whatever, agreed policies and procedures, things like this. Maybe in doing an autopsy they use a particular lab or something like that. Rules, as you know rules and regulations have the authority of law. Of course violating a rule or regulation, violating a rule or regulation is a violation of a law. So in notification for example, the county sheriff or the other law enforcement officer involved they may make specific rules and regs as to how that notification would occur, within which time limits it has to be made, this kind of thing. I think there is a distinct difference, as I say, one is going to be absolute things, others would be the practices they generally follow that they would all pretty much agree on, you might say like practices here in the Legislature, we don't allow the press to do filming on the sides, most of the time, things like this. So, they are both distinct and different.

SENATOR MURPHY: If I may Senator in five and Section 4, you say the board will provide advisory consultive, not advisory, consultive services. What constitutes consultive services and to whom? If we set up these regional offices and train all of our attorneys and have a department director who is a man of particular expertise in forensic medicine, what sort of consultive services do you envision, and the reason I ask is that I note that we will be paying a hundred dollars a day plus expenses to this board that is mandated to meet at least once a year and under this consultive session might be meeting weekly, although I exaggerate, I hope, but nevertheless what sort of consultive work would the board do if we established these districts?

SENATOR DeCAMP: I am not a medical doctor so I have to kind of speculate a little bit.....
