the dollars they are entitled to. In some cases community colleges, when you do that, and I think that is the best example because primarily they are funded out of mill levies with some aid from the state, but in the end some of the community colleges were suffering a loss and I think I have the figures here in my file on what they anticipated as the income from the previous experience of a number of these people in the National Guard attending community colleges.

SENATOR LAMB: Okay, then as I understand it then the state will be picking up that money that really the community colleges or some other institution was picking up before and I see nothing wrong with that.

SENATOR KOCH: If you will look at the fiscal note you will notice there is a figure there of \$42,022. That is the estimated amount of money that would go to the community colleges for the fiscal year and I think that Senator Warner appropriated that directly to the Guard in anticipation.

SENATOR LAMB: One more question, I remember at the hearing that the National Guard was concerned that they would be involved in much more paper work in order to facilitate this. Is that true?

SENATOR KOCH: Yes, I recall that argument that they gave but, no, the National Guard should be getting used to paper work because they are used to working with the Department of Defense and others so I don't think that amount will bother them that much, particularly on an annual basis only and I also think it is a good audit and review of us to them in terms of the number of students they actually have in the program.

SENATOR LAMB: Thank you.
