SENATOR NEWELL: Yes, I would like to have the roll called.

PRESIDENT: Or do you want just to call it? I don't care. It is up to you.

SENATOR NEWELL: Let's do a roll call and could you explain what the amendment is, too.

PRESIDENT: Mr. Clerk, would you read the amendment one more time?

CLERK: Mr. President, the amendment is to strike \$26 and insert \$28.

PRESIDENT: And again repeating what I said for Senator Clark, it takes a majority of those voting at this point. It is an amendment to the amendment. Proceed with the roll call, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: Roll call vote taken. (See page 371, Legislative Journal.) 21 ayes, 22 nays, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: Motion fails. The amendment to the amendment is not adopted. Any further motions on the desk?

CLERK: Yes, sir.

PRESIDENT: All right, if you want to raise the Call and go through this all over again, the Call is raised.

CLERK: Mr. President, Senator Marsh moves to amend the Marsh amendment by striking \$26 and inserting \$27.

PRESIDENT: The Chair recognizes Senator Marsh.

SENATOR MARSH: Mr. President, I call the question. Everyone is aware what the amendment will do.

PRESIDENT: Senator Chambers.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Mr. Chairman, I hope this is a timely point to object to the question being called because there has been no discussion whatsoever.

PRESIDENT: I think that at least you ought to discuss it. Senator Marsh, why don't you at least discuss it and then let's let somebody talk and then we will vote on it if you want to cease debate again.
