PRESIDENT: The question then is the adoption of the Johnson amendment to LB 35. All those in favor vote aye, opposed nay. Have you all voted? Record the vote.

CLERK: 26 ayes, 0 nays on the motion to adopt, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: Motion carries. The amendment is adopted. Are there any further amendments, Mr. Clerk?

CLERK: Mr. President, Senator Warner now moves to amend: (Read Warner amendment.)

PRESIDENT: The Chair recognizes Senator Warner.

SENATOR WARNER: Mr. President, I'm sorry. That could be withdrawn. It was comparable to part of what...similar to the amendment that we just adopted.

PRESIDENT: So you are withdrawing the amendment, Senator Warner? The amendment is withdrawn. Any further amendments, Mr. Clerk?

CLERK: Mr. President, Senator Haberman now moves to indefinitely postpone.

PRESIDENT: Senator Haberman. A motion to indefinitely postpone.

SENATOR HABERMAN: Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: The Chair recognizes Senator Haberman.

SENATOR HABERMAN: Now that we are all totally confused, now that the amendments have been offered and they have been explained on the floor, I don't understand them. I have been listening very closely. The only thing I understand is what I read that is printed in the book and it is printed in the book that the study is going to cost \$250,000 this year. It is printed in the bill book that if the studies are adopted in '80-'81 it is going to cost \$5,000,000. That I can understand. I have been down here...this is my second session and it is awfully hard for me and I would like to think that I am not the only senator to understand amendment after amendment after amendment when it is being passed out on the floor and being explained at the same time.
