

legislation that ultimately we will fund them. Right now it says to whatever degree we wish but once you have established them and they are, in fact, in law, they are going to be needs and you are going to fund them. I think back to the studies we have funded on electricity and power in this state. We have wasted, we have wasted \$150,000. For two years we have had rented studies made to determine what should be done and absolutely nothing has come of those studies because they were made by outside people. It did not really conform to the kind of information that you need to make decisions but when you start offering a laundry list of services that shall be considered, telephone, education, things that the people who are going to be paying for these things many times do not have for themselves, you are creating a real monster. I suggest to you that this is the camel's nose in the tent, that amendments will be accepted right down to where we strike the enacting clause, anything to get this thing started. Now the Governor has already appointed a little Hoover Commission that could do much to perfect what this bill addresses itself to and I need only remind you of our dear friend, Senator Carpenter, who stood on this floor one day and when he could not get the Legislature to outright authorize the purchase of Hiram Scott, it kept getting amended and amended and amended and when it finally went across the floor, I think there was kind of a general suggestion that we realized that there was a place called Hiram Scott and one year later we owned it. There was no commitment on the part of the Legislature to do that. When you start directing in the detail that this bill goes to, what shall be studied and implying it shall be funded, then I think you are, in fact, creating the whole act and I very much support the kill motion. This is not the kind of a proposition that should come before this body.
