SENATOR CHAMBERS: No, he wasn't asking...

SENATOR HABERMAN: No, I was not asking Senator Chambers a question.

PRESIDENT: All right, so, Senator Chambers, state your point of personal privilege.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: I just want for the record to make it clear that I did not say he told me he would withdraw his motion. I said I hoped that he would and I think if you checked the record you will see that is what I said. PRESIDENT: All right, that will end all the debate on the motion to indefinitely postpone. The question before the House is shall LB 35 be indefinitely postponed. All those in favor vote aye, opposed nay. Have you all voted? Senator Haberman, what do you wish to do?

SENATOR HABERMAN: How many are excused?

PRESIDENT: Four.

SENATOR HABERMAN: I will ask for a Call of the House and a roll call vote. No, wait a minute. Wait a minute.

PRESIDENT: You did ask for a Call of the House so...well we can vote on a Call of the House anyway.

SENATOR HABERMAN: Okay, and a roll call vote.

PRESIDENT: So the motion is shall the House go under Call. All those in favor vote aye, opposed nay. Record the vote.

CLERK: 25 ayes, 0 nays to go under Call, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: The House is under Call. The Sergeant at Arms will bring every member back to his or her desk and all unauthorized personnel will leave the floor and all legislators will register their presence. Senator Wagner, Senator Fitzgerald, Senator Marvel, Senator Pirsch, Senator Venditte. Senator Landis is here. Now we have got one more. Senator Beutler. We have only one person who is not excused. That is Senator Beutler. Will the Sergeant at Arms attempt to find Senator Beutler? All right, Senator Beutler is here. Proceed then with a roll call vote, Mr. Clerk.
