PRESIDENT: The Chair recognizes Senator Hefner.

SENATOR HEFNER: Mr. Chairman, members of the body, I have a question of Senator Marvel, if he is here.

PRESIDENT: He is in his office. Do you want us to get him?

SENATOR HEFNER: Then I guess I would address this question to Senator Lewis, as Chairman of the Exec Board.

PRESIDENT: You will have to go someplace else to find him.

SENATOR HEFNER: He isn't here either, hmmm? I wonder where all our leaders are. I will address this question to you then, Mr. Speaker.

PRESIDENT: I don't think they will let me answer because I have to declare an extreme prejudice on any answer I give you on this question so I think you are better off not to ask me anything about this question. Senator Marsh says she will answer it.

SENATOR HEFNER: Do we transcribe the entire proceedings of the body of the Legislature here?

PRESIDENT: Senator Marsh.

SENATOR MARSH: Yes, with the exception of every word of Final Reading.

SENATOR HEFNER: Okay, what happens when we are on Final Reading, do we shut off the machine?

SENATOR MARSH: Mr. Clerk. I believe we do.

CLERK: That is correct, Senator.

SENATOR HEFNER: Okay, then the Final Reading (interruption).

SENATOR MARSH: Since the Final Reading is already printed, it isn't necessary to transcribe it again.

SENATOR HEFNER: Okay, thank you.

PRESIDENT: The Chair recognizes Senator Venditte. The Chair recognizes Senator DeCamp and he is not here either. Senator Barrett, I know he is here.

SENATOR BARRETT: Mr. President and colleagues, speaking as
