SENATOR DE CAMP: Well, Call the House.

PRESIDENT: Motion to Call the House. All in favor of a Call of the House vote aye, opposed nay. Record the vote.

CLERK: 19 ayes, 0 nays to go under Call, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: The seventh time we will go under Call today. The Sergeant at Arms will bring all the legislators to their desks. All unauthorized personnel leave the floor. All legislators register your presence. Senator Venditte, would you... Senator Keyes, would you let us know you are here. Senator DeCamp.

SENATOR DE CAMP: Could I give a point of information? A couple of senators have asked me which bill this is.

PRESIDENT: Well let the Clerk just tell them what we are voting on.

SENATOR DE CAMP: Well all I want to say is this isn't the first one on General File we were going to take up so if...

PRESIDENT: All right. That is a good point so you know what bill you are voting on which is LB 496 and it is the adoption of the DeCamp amendment. Senator Keyes, Senator Goodrich... Senator Keyes and Senator Newell. Senator DeCamp, shall we accept call ins while we are waiting?

SENATOR DE CAMP: Yes, accept call ins.

PRESIDENT: All right, accept call ins. Here comes Senator Keyes.

CLERK: Senator Goodrich voting aye; Senator Marvel voting aye; Senator Barrett voting no; Senator Wesely voting aye; Senator Venditte voting aye; Senator Kelly voting aye.

PRESIDENT: Record the vote.

CLERK: 26 ayes, 6 nays on the adoption of Senator DeCamp's amendment.

PRESIDENT: All right, the motion passes. The DeCamp amendment is adopted. Are you sure you want to do that before we get the next vote? All right, there is an amendment on the desk. We have to take up the amendment on the desk. Read the amendment.
