SENATOR KOCH: Thank you, Mr. Speaker. It looks as though it might be futile and I will not subject the body to any further intellectual debate.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Record the vote.

CLERK: (Read record vote as found on page 452 of the Legislative Journal.) 11 ayes, 23 nays, 15 not voting, Mr. President.

SPEAKER MARVEL: The motion lost. Before we go to the next item, underneath the north balcony I welcome to Lincoln Mr. and Mrs. Larry Callihan, Blair Callihan, of Grand Island, Nebraska. They are the family of Page, Lisa Callihan. Where are you folks? There you are. What is the next amendment, Mr. Clerk?

CLERK: Mr. President, the next amendment is offered by Senator Vickers and it is found on page 414 of the Legislative Journal. (Read Vickers amendment.) 414 in the Journal, yes, sir.

SPEAKER MARVEL: The Chair recognizes Senator Vickers.

SENATOR VICKERS: Mr. President and members, I introduced this amendment because of some concerns I had related to me by some of the liquor store owners in my district, in particular the city of McCook, because of the fact that they were hiring college students to work in their establishments and they were reading this amendment, Reutzel's amendment, to say that serving would not include package store, that a college age student could still work in the bar but would not be able to work in the package stores. I offer this amendment simply to clarify that, and I understand that perhaps the word "serving" could mean package stores also, it could mean a closed six-pack or a closed bottle, but it would seem to me that we should make it more clear of our intent and I think our intent was to allow now the 20 year olds...or the 19 year olds to continue to work in these establishments. That was the way the Reutzel amendment was worded, I believe, and if that was our intent that we were going to allow the 19 year olds to work in a bar then we should also allow the 19 year olds to work in a package store. It makes sense to me that we should just clarify that language and put "or selling" in there to make that more clear.
