CLERK: Mr. President, the motion before us is to suspend Rule 7, Section 3 so as to allow for the consideration of the motion to indefinitely postpone on LB 221.

SENATOR DeCAMP: Mr. President, I will probably end up voting against the bill on Final Reading. I know it has got enough votes to pass, but the point is we have got an awful lot of bills to process this year, one awful lot of heavy stuff, and if we start using one technical maneuver after another to stall or buy time, it is going to hurt us all. So whether you are for or against the bill, it seemed to me kind of half-way reasonable to let him take a position now as long we have got it before the floor, and if it has got the votes to kill it, fine and if not let Senator Kelly have his vote to advance it. With regard to printing it, it will be printed once it is advanced, and you can make your decisions then as to whether you need to do anything further.

SPEAKER MARVEL: The motion is the suspension of the rules to take up the kill motion. Is that the way it reads? Okay, all those in favor of suspending the rules vote aye, opposed no. Have you all voted? Okay, record.

CLERK: 30 ayes, 7 nays to suspend the rules, Mr. President.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Okay, the rules are suspended. The Chair now recognizes Senator Koch.

SENATOR KOCH: Which motion are we on, Mr. Speaker? Another special order? Are we on the kill motion, or what are we on?

SPEAKER MARVEL: Yes, sir, we are considering your kill motion. That is the reason I recognized you.

SENATOR KOCH: Thank you.
