We are going to move it because we don't want to have to listen to it for another hour of drudgerous debate, and that may happen, but I can assure my good friend, Senator Kelly, that I will offer the kill motion on Final Reading and by then, hopefully, there will be some new ideas to amend this bill so it is as fair as possible.
