SENATOR MARESH: Unless somebody decides to vote.

PRESIDENT: Record what is on the board. The motion before the House is, shall the House go under Call? All those in favor vote aye, opposed nay. Have you all voted on the Call? Record the vote.

CLERK: 18 ayes, 2 nays to go under Call, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: The motion carries. The House is under Call. The Sergeant at Arms will see that all members are returned to the chamber. All members will return to their desks. Unauthorized personnel will leave the floor. Legislators will please register your presence. Senator Kelly, do you want to let us know you are here? Senator Pirsch, good morning. Senator Nichol is around. I see him. Senator Hoagland, would you show us you are here? Senator Newell, would you let us know you are here? Senator Koch, will you let us know you are here. Do you want to take call-ins, Senator Maresh? Do you want to take call-ins?

SENATOR MARESH: How many are here, about 39?

PRESIDENT: We have got about 39 here right...40 right now. Would all members please take your...go to your desks. The House is under Call. It is very difficult to find out who is here if you wander around. Senator Schmit, Senator Reutzel, Senator Goodrich. Senator Reutzel, Senator Goodrich and Senator Schmit, I believe, are the ones that are not here. Senator Maresh, did you say you would take call-in votes? All right, we will have call-in votes if anybody wants to vote.

CLERK: Senator Newell voting...

PRESIDENT: Senator Marsh.

SENATOR MARSH: I move the Call be raised since senators are not in their seats.

PRESIDENT: All right, we will have a roll call vote. The House is under Call. All legislators will return to their desks. We will have a roll call vote and we will get on with it. Proceed with the roll call vote, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: (Read roll call vote as found on page 485 of the Legislative Journal.) 25 ayes, 13 nays on the motion to adopt, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: The motion carries. The amendment is adopted.
