

you are changing the law is a very devious and dangerous way and that you have been tricked and that what you are doing is you are defining routine marijuana as hashish and thereby putting the average person that smokes, plays around with marijuana in the category of the heavy, heavy felon hashish peddler. That is my allegation to you. Senator Reutzell, you said I was all wrong, that it is a pound or more. I repeat the allegation so you understand it one more time, then I will explain it. You are defining, you are defining marijuana as hashish, even though you don't know you are doing it. How are you doing it? On page 9, you are saying "or any substance...any material, preparation, mixture, compound, or other substance which contains six per cent or more by weight of tetrahydrocannabinols" is hashish or (mike off). As a practical matter, a very significant amount of your marijuana, just plain old marijuana that maybe even one person in this room may have smoked at one time or another has six percent tetrahydrocannabinols. So you are simply saying marijuana is hashish, and if you smoke hashish, then you are saying you go to prison for fifty years. That is the trick. If anybody can prove me wrong, I would be happy to as I say apologize. If I am right, I think you had better send the bill back to committee and learn what you are doing with it. Senator Schmit and many others are concerned about pushers. We have had hearing after hearing, study after study over the years. I would submit to you that you aren't solving the problem of pusher merely by changing definitions and making everybody a pusher. You are not getting to the real pushers. The bill in its original form had some very, very valuable things, PCP, deadly, deadly. Deal with some of these issues and get them taken care of but don't let somebody come in who maybe lost a case or would like to prosecute more people than he is or whatever or would like to say they are getting pushers and load the bill up with something else. And, Senator Stoney, I am sincere when I tell you I think that there is something in there that none of you have been told about, that all you are really doing is taking marijuana, defining it as hashish and then saying we are going to lock you up for hashish.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Senator Chambers and then Senator Lewis.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Mr. Chairman and members of the Legislature, I think the drug part has been covered and I am looking at page 22 and some of the Senators have asked me about it where a presumption of criminal action is created by the addition of this number three, subdivision number three. What they are saying is that even if a
