CLERK: Senator Nichol voting aye.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Have you all voted? Have you all voted? I will ask for the vote once more. Have you all voted? Record the vote.

SPEAKER MARVEL: We took in call in votes, that is right.

SENATOR KOCH: Except we didn't have all present who are not excused.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Senator Koch, the vote has been announced. Now the question is the request was to lay the bill over. Is that right, Senator Beutler?

SENATOR BEUTLER: Yes, sir.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Is there objection to that? Senator Schmit, do you object?

SENATOR SCHMIT: Mr. President, I object to that, yes.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Pardon.

SENATOR SCHMIT: I object to that request.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Okay, the discussion on the Schmit amendment is still before the House. Senator Beutler, you have your light on. Senator Nichol, you have your light on. Do you wish to be recognized?
