

sure see some problem with it. As a result of having negotiated hundreds of leases, if you just draw on that kind of experience, take one look at this particular sentence and it is wide open. It says, a lease agreement entered into pursuant to this section shall provide for \$1.00 a year lease payment, no argument. Such lease may be renegotiated annually but shall not exceed a \$1.00 a year payment. The way it is worded you can put the truck, the tank, everything else through that loophole as long as you keep the \$1.00 a year. You can charge for anything else you want to in the renegotiations. It is an extremely loosely worded...if you want to limit the lease to \$1.00 a year, you should word this different and say just exactly what you want to do, but you are opening a negotiation arrangement there that you can drive a truck through any time you want to. I would oppose the amendment until it is worded in such a way that it means what Senator Wesely says it means.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Senator Fitzgerald.

SENATOR FITZGERALD: Mr. Speaker, I oppose this amendment. We had this contract made up from Paul Douglas' office. I mean I thought he had the wisdom and the talent to make this contract and it is a contract a \$1.00 a year, a five-year option up to a hundred years, and the county has agreed with this, and the state has agreed with it. So his amendment here... I mean I know he is trying to kill the bill. I will agree with it, I mean, I don't know what he has got against the veterans, I mean, maybe one of these days he will be a veteran with the condition that the world is now. I hope not, because I don't even think he would make a good soldier, but when I get onto that subject, so he just does not agree with the bill and this here, he is opening this here up so much I mean it is pitiful. The County Attorney has made the agreement. The County Attorney says we will live with this agreement and his wisdom, I know he is not an attorney, I do not know what he is trying to get at, but I oppose the amendment.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Senator Venditte.

SENATOR VENDITTE: Mr. Speaker and members of the Legislature, I first of all rise to oppose the Wesely amendment, and, Senator Wesely, a question, please. Where did you get this particular amendment, Senator?

SENATOR WESELY: I don't understand your question.

SENATOR VENDITTE: From where did the amendment originate? Was it....
